Reading: K&D Co ("K&D Co") is registered and having their place of business in Bhuvaneshwar. PG Oil Mills Co ("PG Co") is registered and place of business in Vishakhapatnam. On 02nd January 2020, Representative of K&D Co communicated an order of a ton of oil cakes for INR 5,00,000 from PG Co.

1. Instance (1)

In the above given reading, suppose the communication of the Representative, K&D Co was on the mobile of Manager. In between their negotiation, the line got distracted due to an Airplane passing overhead and the communication was not complete. Later K&D Co filed suit of non-performance of contract against PG Co. Advice

2. Instance (2)

In the above given reading, suppose the communication was over a letter sent by Representative of K&D but with a wrong address. The letter reached the Manager of PG on 15th February. Immediately upon the receipt of the order, the Manager of PG arranged a carrier with specified amount of oil cakes to Bhuvaneshwar. K&D Co returned the consignment stating that the offer was not accepted. Can PG claim the compensation for breach of contract?

- 3. Nalayanan and Swarithi were husband and wife. While Swarithi was alive, Nalayanan promised to marry Jasmeela in the event of Swarithi's death. Two years after Swarithi's death, Jasmeela sued against Nalayanan for damages for breach of promise to marry her. Whether Jasmeela's suit is actionable?
- 4. Chopra Film Producers Company made an agreement with father of Baby Manjima, a minor girl to act in a film. Father entered into the agreement on behalf of his minor child. Later, Baby Manjima was not able to act in the film produced by Chopra Film Producers. Chopra Film Producers sued against father of Baby Manjima to recover the damages they suffered. Advice?
- 5. Sumanan undergone a heart surgery. Without disclosing the surgery, he subscribed a medical insurance from Mediplus Insurance Co. Later the Company repudiated the policy. Decide whether the repudiation from the part of Company justifiable?
- 6. Sonu, son of Sanojanan forged Rameshiah's name to a promissory note. Rameshiah under threat of prosecuting Sonu obtains a bond from Sanojanan for the amount of the forged note. Later Rameshiah sued for execution of the bond. Decide?



FAMILY LAW - I

Time: 2 Hours Maximum Marks: 20

PART - A (20 Marks)

Answer all the questions in detail with relevant legal provisions and judicial pronouncements wherever necessary:

- 1. Mr. Varunan was married to Mrs. Veenita in January 2020. Mrs. Veenita gave birth to girlin April 2020 and a boy in May, 2021. Mr. Varunan files a petition in court and claims that the boy child was born through his relationship with Mrs. Veenita, but declines his fatherhood for the girl child. He claims that he was unaware of the wife's pregnancy at the time of marriage and files a petition for nullity of marriage. It is proved in court that Mr. Varunan is not the father of the girl child. As an Advocate for Mrs. Veenita, advise her to defend the case for nullity of marriage under the following situations.
 - a) When Mr. and Mrs. Varunan married under Hindu Marriage Act, 1955
 - b) When Mr. and Mrs. Varunan married under Special Marriage Act, 1956 (8 marks)
- 2. Mr. Vijayanth and Mrs. Sharonea were married according to Christian Laws in India in 2002. Mr. Vijayanth was a doctor working in Australia and soon after their marriage, Mrs. Sharonea moved to Australia and they were living together since then. Mrs. Sharonea often insults the qualification of Mr. Vijayanth as a doctor (although he is one of most efficient doctors in Australia, specializing in Cardiology). There were frequent quarrels between them and Mr. Vijayanth alleged that his wife treated him in an insulting manner, kept complaining him for various reasons and humiliated him in front of the others which even included the hospital workers. Frequent quarrels led to mental depression of

both of them. In 2004, she returned to India with their daughter and Mr. Vijayanthdidn't know the whereabouts of them till 2006, when he decides to find them. When Mr. Vijayanth and his mother tried to visit Mrs. Sharonea, they were not allowed inside the house even after numerous visits. He finally decides to file for divorce under the ground of mental cruelty.

- a. Decide on the case when Mr. Vijayanth files a petition for divorce on the ground of mental cruelty. Will his conduct of not knowing the whereabouts of his wife and daughter affect the decision for divorce?
- **b.** In the same petition filed by Mr. Vijayanth, can Mrs. Sharonea claim for a relief of divorce under the ground of the cruelty against her husband?
